ORDER CANCELLING LICENSE

The Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration (ABRA) has reviewed its records and determined that Kabab-Ji DC One, LLC, t/a Kababji, (Respondent), located at 1351 Connecticut Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C., has failed to pay the second year license fees for its License No. ABRA-082446 a Retailer's Class CR License. Specifically, the Respondent failed to make the second year payment for its license by March 31, 2014, the deadline for all Retailer's CR licenses, despite being notified of the payment date.


On May 1, 2014, the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) issued an Order to Cease and Desist against Kabab-Ji DC One, LLC, t/a Kababji, pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-829 (2001), for failure to make the second year payment for its Retailer's Class CR License. On May 1, 2014, ABRA's Enforcement Division confirmed that the Respondent is out of business.

It is hereby **ORDERED** on this 14th day of May, 2014, that Kabab-Ji DC One, LLC's License No. ABRA-082446 is **CANCELLED**. A copy of this Order shall be sent to the Respondent.


