### **FINDINGS**

#### 1. **AUTHORIZATION:**

Chapter 47 of title 27 of the DCMR Section 4719 and PPRA Sec. 405 (d); Emergency Procurements.

#### 2. **MINIMUM NEED:**

The Department of General Services (DGS) has an immediate need for High Sierra Pools, Inc. to provide Emergency Pool Maintenance and Repair Services at pools located throughout the District of Columbia in accordance with Chapter 47 of title 27 of the DCMR Section 4719 and PPRA Sec. 405 (d); Emergency Procurements.

#### 3. ESTIMATED FAIR AND REASONABLE PRICE:

The estimated fair and reasonable price is up to \$146,500.00.

#### 4. FACTS WHICH JUSTIFY AN EMERGENCY PROCUREMENT:

The purpose of this emergency contract is to ensure pools remain available to users in the District. Maintaining sanitary conditions for users creates a healthy environment for users to swim; therefore, mandatory for the Department of General Services. It is the mission and the responsibility of the Department of General Services to provide building and grounds services for facilities owned and occupied by the District government field (D.C. Code § 10-551.01(b) (4), The Department of General Services services. Establishment Act of 2011.)

A competitive procurement process was not practical under these circumstances and a new contract could not be competitively bid and awarded in time to have a certified Pool Maintenance and Repair contractor in place to provide the required services. Failure to have sanitary pools in working order may result in potentially unsafe environments and cause illness or harm to user of facilities with pools in the District.
