DETERMINATION AND FINDINGS FOR AN EMERGENCY PROCUREMENT

CAPTION: Consolidated Maintenance Services at Calvin Coolidge High School/Ida B. Well Middle School

AGENCY: Department of General Services (DGS)

CONTRACTOR: Spectrum Management, LLC ("SPECTRUM")

CONTRACT NO.: DCAM-20-NC-EM-0019

FINDINGS

1. AUTHORIZATION:

D.C. Official Code §2-354.05 and 27 DCMR 4719

2. MINIMUM NEED:

The District of Columbia, Department of General Services ("**Department**" or "**DGS**"), Facilities Management Division requires an immediate need for Spectrum Management, LLC ("**Contractor**" or "**SPECTRUM**") to continue providing Consolidated Maintenance Services at Calvin Coolidge High School /Ida B. Wells for an emergency period not to exceed 120-days.

3. ESTIMATED FAIR AND REASONABLE PRICE:

The estimated fair and reasonable price for 120-days is Four Hundred Twenty Thousand, Seven Hundred One Dollars and seventy-two cents (\$420,701.72) for basic services, plus a not-to-exceed amount of One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) for cost reimbursement.

4. FACTS WHICH JUSTIFY AN EMERGENCY PROCUREMENT:

The purpose of this emergency procurement is to prevent an imminent threat to health, welfare, property and safety; and to prevent serious disruption in agency operations. It is the mission of DGS to provide first rate maintenance at District government facilities (including schools).

An emergency contract with Spectrum Management, LLC is needed to prevent the serious and imminent threat to the health and safety of the staff and students at Calvin Coolidge High School/Ida B. Well Middle School. Due to the safety of children and personnel, these services require uninterrupted service.

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The Contractor referenced above is the only vendor who can meet the District's minimum need without disruption of services at this time. The estimated cost to the District for this temporary emergency period of 120-days is fair and reasonable based on DGS' historical data on similar services.

5. CERTIFICATION BY THE FACILITIES INTERIM DEPUTY DIRECTOR:

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
