DETERMINATION AND FINDINGS FOR A SOLE SOURCE PROCUREMENT

FINDINGS

1. AUTHORIZATION:

D.C. Official Code §2-354.04 and Title 27 DCMR 4718

2. MINIMUM NEED:

The Department of General Services ("DGS" or the "Department"), on behalf of Protective Services Division ("PSD"), has an immediate need for U-Street Parking, Inc ("USP" or "Contractor") to provide Security Guard Services at the DHS CCNV Hypothermia Site in order to avoid a disruption of services and ensure a safe environment for the citizens, employees and visitors of the District Government facility while a new solicitation for these services is procured following major scope changes.

3. ESTIMATED FAIR AND REASONABLE PRICE:

The estimated fair and reasonable price for the Contract is in accordance with the Contractor's firm, fixed and fully loaded, direct hourly rates. The Total Not-To-Exceed Contract Value is \$950,000.00.

4. FACTS WHICH JUSTIFY AN EMERGENCY PROCUREMENT:

It is the mission of DGS to provide a safe environment and protection against internal and external threats to citizens, employees and visitors of District Government facilities and to ensure a safe environment for the citizens, employees and visitors of the District of Columbia. The purpose of this sole source contract is to prevent a disruption in Security Guard Services and avoid potentially life-threatening situations for citizens, employees

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and visitors of the DHS CCNV Hypothermia Shelter located at 425 2nd Street NW Washington, DC 20004.

- 1. The Contractor listed above has the capacity and is cable of meeting requirements to provide security guard personnel services at the DHS CCNV Hypothermia Shelter.
- 2. A competitive procurement process is not practicable under the current circumstances with the urgent need for security in support of unforeseen potential disruptions or altercations.
- 3. The Department has determined that it is in the best interest of the District to extend a sole source contract with USP on an emergency basis for the period of November 13, 2022 through April 18, 2023.
- 4. The Department is in the final procurement stage of issuing a new solicitation for security guard services within the next 30 days.
- 5. The current contractor is providing satisfactory services and is uniquely positioned to ensure the continuity of services.
- 6. A sole source contract is the most advantageous method to avoid a life threating situation and disruption services; it ensures a continuation of service while the District prepares and finalizes a solicitation for competition and award a multiple year contract upon Council approval.
