INDINGS

1. **AUTHORIZATION:**

Chapter 47 of title 27 of the DCMR Section 4719 and PPRA Sec. 405 (d); *Emergency Procurements*.

2. MINIMUM NEED:

The Department of General Services (DGS) has an immediate need for the aforementioned Contractor to provide comprehensive, consolidated maintenance services including facility Operations, maintenance, and repair services (OM&R) for the District's newly constructed Short-Term Family Housing facility in Ward 1 including the management, supervision, labor, materials, supplies, and equipment, storage vehicles to ensure effective performance at the Short-Term Facility at Ward 1. Services shall be carried out for a period of no more than 120-days in accordance with Chapter 47 of title 27 of the DCMR Section 4719 and PPRA Sec. 405 (d); Emergency Procurements.

3. ESTIMATED FAIR AND REASONABLE PRICE:

The estimated fair and reasonable price for Basic Services is \$141,600.00. Related Supplemental Services will be provided on an as-needed basis in accordance with the firm, fixed and fully-loaded, direct hourly labor rates described below. Supplemental and Related services will be paid on a cost reimbursable basis and shall not exceed \$75,000 during the 120-day emergency contract service period.

4. FACTS WHICH JUSTIFY AN EMERGENCY PROCUREMENT:

In accordance with the D.C. Official Code §2-354.05 and 27 DCMR 4719, the purpose of this emergency contract is to prevent the unsafe and unclean workspace that would cause a threat to public health, welfare, and property, and to prevent a disruption of the daily operations at short-term family housing at Ward 1. It is the mission and the responsibility of the Department of General Services to provide building services for facilities owned and occupied by the District government; these responsibilities include providing landscaping, operations, maintenance at Short-Term family housing. (D.C. Code § 10-551.01(b) (4), "The Department of General Services Establishment Act of 2011").

The Department goal is to prevent, to the greatest extent possible, any future issues of consolidated maintenance through regular upkeep, as well as to be able to respond quickly to abate any maintenance problems as soon as possible after they arise. With severe low in temperatures and the inclement weather season is approaching the capacity and responsiveness of smaller Contractor providing services has become an issue. This has become an issue as we address an influx of emergency repairs. The Contractor listed above have the capacity and are cable of meeting requirements to prevent unsafe environments and ensuring staff, workspaces and living quarters, homeless shelters, Municipal buildings and visiting areas at all Citywide locations are occupied in habitable environment.

A competitive procurement process is not practicable under the current circumstances with the threat of temperatures decreasing well above manageable ranges and creating increased threats of hyperthermia environments. The Department has a number of active contracts and Contractor tasked to respond to rapidly increasing work order maintenance and repair services; however, prolonged inclement weather will affect contractor response times and diminishing contract capacity thus the emergency contract efforts are required to sustain building operations and ensure safe environments across city buildings.

5. CERTIFICATION BY THE DEPUTY DIRECTOR OF FACILITIES MANAGEMENT DIVISION:

I hereby certify to the best of my knowledge and belief, all of my statements are true, correct, and complete and that the information given herein is true and accurate.
