DETERMINATION AND FINDINGS FOR EMERGENCY PROCUREMENT

Agency: Department of General Services (the "Department" or "DGS")

Caption: DCAM-22-NC-EM-0004 Emergency Sector 2 Security Guard Services

Contractor: Security Assurance Management, Inc. (SAM)

FINDINGS

1. AUTHORIZATION:

Chapter 47 of title 27 of the DCMR Section 4719 and PPRA Sec. 405 (d); *Emergency Procurements*.

2. MINIMUM NEED:

The Department of General Services (DGS) has an immediate need for Security Assurance Management Inc. (SAM) to provide Security Guard Services in Sectors 2 on behalf of the Department of General Services for Protective Services Division located at 64 New York Avenue NE Washington, DC in accordance with Chapter 47 of title 27 of the DCMR Section 4719 and PPRA Sec. 405 (d); *Emergency Procurements*.

3. ESTIMATED FAIR AND REASONABLE PRICE:

The estimated fair and reasonable price is up to \$995,000.00

4. FACTS WHICH JUSTIFY AN EMERGENCY PROCUREMENT:

The purpose of this emergency procurement is to prevent an imminent threat to public health, welfare, property, and safety, and to prevent serious disruption in agency operations. It is the mission of DGS to provide first rate security guard services at District Government facilities and to ensure a safe environment for employees and visitors of District owned and operated facilities. (D.C. Code § 10-551.01(b) (4), The *Department of General Services Establishment Act of 2011*.)

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A competitive procurement process was not practical under these circumstances and a new contract could not be competitively bid and awarded in time to have Security Guard Services in place to provide the required services. Failure to have Security Guard Services may result in life threatening situations for District employees, residents and visitors of District owned and operated facilities.

5. CERTIFICATION BY THE DEPUTY ASSOCIATE DIRECTOR:

I hereby certify all statements herein are true, correct, and complete and that the information given herein is accurate to the best of my knowledge and belief. Moreover, I understand that making a false statement is punishable by criminal penalties pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 22-2405 et sq. (2001). I understand that any information I give may be investigated as allowed by law or regulation.
