For further clarification the Department of Transportation, Division of Urban Forestry is the sole entity responsible maintenance, manicuring and pruning of all trees throughout the District of Columbia Government property portfolio. Thus, all requirements for tree maintenance, manicuring and pruning services under this Solicitation and the forthcoming Contract are hereby <u>removed</u> by

Periodic Landscaping Maintenance Service Cycle Standards

Delete in its Entirety:

Section C.8.3.2.5.1 Shrubs and Ground Cover

Replace with:

Section C.8.3.2.5.1 Shrubs and Ground Cover.

The Contractor must prune all shrubs and ground cover plants growing in the Pruning Service Areas, to maintain plants in a healthy, growing, flowering condition, and plant growth to prevent the encroachment of passageways, walks, streets, views of signs per the COTR. All shrub and ground cover material shall be pruned by the Contractor to ensure the best shape, health, and character of the individual plant. Ground cover plants shall be selectively cut back by the Contractor to encourage lateral growth and kept in bounds and out of other plants, walkways and lighting. Mechanical trimming may only be utilized by the Contractor when the health or appearance of the plant will not be damaged.

- 1. Always prune 1/4" to 1/2" above a node (which is the spot where a leaf joins a stem). The node is where dormant buds are located. These will grow out into new stems.
- 2. Do not prune below or somewhere in between two nodes as this will leave a stub. This section (called the internode) can't grow new stems, but what it can do is become infected and rot, or just die and become unsightly.



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- 3. Prune to nodes with buds that face away from the center of the plant, and in the direction you want them to grow. This will help to avoid cross branching.
- 4. Never cut a branch off flush with the trunk or stem. The place where a branch joins the main trunk or larger branch is usually slightly swollen and is called a collar. The collar is special tissue that can quickly grow over and seal the wound when you prune off the branch. Always protect the collar.
