PROJECT OVERVIEW

The Edgewood project includes replacement of the existing facility with a new, state-of-the-art recreation center containing an indoor gymnasium, fitness room, multipurpose rooms, computer, youth and senior lounges and rooftop farm. Exterior improvements include new sport courts, new playground, walking track, splash pad and athletic field improvements.

WHAT HAPPENED IN NOVEMBER...

- Completed concrete slab on grade pour in the future gymnasium area (eastern side).
- Started underground electrical and plumbing installations in the western side of building.
- Completed all concrete footer pours for the new building.
- Began placement of steel within the future gymnasium area (eastern side).
- Began removal of "rakers" on the northern retaining wall.
- Continued below grade waterproofing of the building's foundation walls.

WHAT TO EXPECT IN DECEMBER...

- Completion of the concrete slab on grade pour in the western side of the building.
- Completion of removal of all "rakers" bracing eastern retaining wall.
- Continued backfill around the northern and eastern foundation walls.
- Continued installation of steel in the western section of the new building.
- Installation of the telecommunications duct bank.
- Installation of the masonry walls in the gymnasium area (eastern side) of the building.

DID YOU KNOW?

In the 19th century, the project area was part of a large tract of land known as Metropolis View, which was owned by Washington Berry, a veteran of the War of 1812. The estate was used to house Union forces during the Civil War. Over the years, the parcel changed ownership many times until being developed into a park shortly after World War II.
