

1. There's no reference to any dog park or access. Will that be considered?

2. With the lessons learned from COVID, will there be spaces with ventilation and/or for outdoor classroom, gathering and meeting space?
 - [Yes! This project includes significant investment in outdoor spaces, including areas for gathering and community events.](#)
3. Is there a formula for how many parking spaces are available after employees take their slots based on how many people are estimated to use the facility and park? I'm concerned that there isn't enough. Too bad you couldn't provide an underground parking and have the facility on top.
 - [Yes, DCRA has code requirements for minimum parking requirements. We have actually exceeded the minimum number of parking spots for this project.](#)
4. Hi, it seems there are no improvements or expansion to the pool. Can we add some shade elements to the current pool if nothing else? There is no shade at the pool.
 - [Thank you. We are evaluating the possibility of adding shade at the existing outdoor pool.](#)
5. Trash management has been a continual issue in the area around/within the park. Is there a plan to manage the trash issue when the space is developed?
 - [Yes, DPR / DGS work with DPW on placement of dumpsters and trash receptacles based on the size and location of the facility. We will work with DPW to get additional information on trash pickup and schedule.](#)

7. Will the original outdoor pool be eliminated?

8. Are you all aware that Marshall ES served as precinct 139 for our neighborhood? Has consideration been given to continue to have the new building serve as a precinct for the neighborhood during Election years? And the design elements that are needed to have a modern precinct accessible for everyone?
 - [Many DPR facility serve as voting centers, with gymnasiums and large community spaces being used for voting. The new facility at Fort Lincoln will be able to accommodate future voting activity.](#)

10. Apologies, has the original outdoor pool been eliminated from the current plans?
 - No, the existing outdoor pool at Theodore Hagens is to remain.
11. Can we recap where the outdoor facilities mentioned by Adrienne are physically located? What is the plan for Hagens Center and pool? How many parking spaces are there?
 - The Theodore Hagens facility will remain in place as will the outdoor pool. The outdoor parking around Theodore Hagens will remain the same. There are 41 parking spaces around the Theodore Hagens facility / tennis court area.
12. I am confused with how the Hagens center fits into everything. It sounds like it stays the way it is. Am I incorrect?
 - The Theodore Hagens facility will remain in place (and operational) as will the outdoor pool.
13. Can the roof top be utilized? Be green and maybe provide a view to the city?
 - Yes, a green roof is being considered by the design team and will be contingent on available funding.
14. There's certainly a need for a dog park.

15. Did we just obliterate any demarcation of the fort, or the US Colored Troops? I see designers happy with their work but where is the clear evidence of historical significance.
 - An Archaeological Assessment of the project site was completed in 2020 and submitted to the DC Historic Preservation Office. This assessment indicated that there are no existing remnants of the historic fort structures or other historic military archaeological sites within the Community Center project boundaries. This was the case before this project began. The design for this project does not intend to remove or demolish any elements of archaeological importance, as there are no indications that any elements exist within the project boundary.
16. The outdoor fitness option is amazing. Most people who utilize the feature also have small children. Can there be children equipment close to that instead of the water feature so far away?
 - Thanks for this feedback. This is an idea that we will explore.
17. Will DC residents have access to the playground by the early childhood center or is that reserved for the center students only?
 - Residents will have access to the ECE playground after hours and on weekends.
18. Will there be 8 or more tennis courts?
 - The number of tennis courts will remain the same (8). We are working with our tennis coordinator to assess the courts to determine how to best address any current issues.
19. I'm confused, if you know there's been a request and a need for dog parks why not include it in the plans in the first place?

20. Yes we've voiced it during the initial survey phase.

21. I don't remember an elevated indoor running track as an option
22. The children's section within the historical area, the stage area has a very difficult way of climbing to it. Can steps to the stage area by the pit be added along with an outlet?
 - Great question. We are evaluating the feasibility of adding additional outdoor outlets to accommodate the stage area.
23. The park used to have amazing views of the skyline, but with recent development, those views are no longer available to park goers. Will there be anyplace (e.g., rooftops, hilltops) where those views will be restored?
 - Yes! The landscape architecture team is working to identify locations within the park space where views can be potentially restored.
24. Greetings. The tennis court has brought tremendous joy, health, and a sense of pride to our ward. Are we thinking about the tennis court because there are several desperate improvements needed?
 - Yes, the tennis courts will be assessed to determine what improvements are needed.
25. Is there any indoor reading room space or "quiet" spaces or small private meeting rooms? Perhaps accompanied by a free library (take one/leave one)?
 - Although there isn't a reading room in the facility, there will be multipurpose rooms and lounges that can be used for reading and quiet activities.
26. How large is the garden space? How much food can the garden with raised bed produce for the community? Will it produce a complete farm to table experience utilizing the community kitchen?
 - The current community garden adjacent to Theodore Hagens Cultural Center is 2,500 SF. We've yet to be able to determine the amount of produce it can sustain for the community, but we do envision incorporating programming related to farm to table at the new facility (using the new demonstration / cooking kitchen).
27. When will construction start on this project? When will the project be completed?
 - We expect construction to begin Fall 2022 with construction ongoing through Summer 2024 (weather permitting).
28. I agree with the comment and question about tennis courts.
29. We expressed a need for a new pool. Why has this request not been entertained?
 - Unfortunately, the project budget does not support the inclusion of an indoor pool at this time.
30. I also agree with the comment/question about the pool
31. Parking is at a premium in the city. Many of the rec centers have very little parking.

- Pickleball has indeed become very popular! In consultation with DPR's Tennis Program Coordinator, we will take a look at striping some of the existing courts for Pickleball.
34. Is there consideration for including an amphitheater for outdoor concerts or theatrical productions?
- Yes, there is an existing amphitheater in the park that should be able to support outdoor events, such as outdoor concerts and other productions.
35. I have never heard about the Core of the park having a historic designation. I am just curious when this development came to light?
- This fact came to light after early conversations and discussions between the design team and the DC Office of Historic Preservation.
36. I noticed in the presentation there was a dotted area near the community center that noted for indoor pool that is not included in Phase 1. is it still possible to include an indoor another phase?
- Yes, it is possible to include an indoor pool at a future phase should funding become available.
37. What is the plan for the old water feature by the gazebos?
- The old water feature is unfortunately outdated and dangerous. We do plan to stabilize and repair and cracked or failing bricks.
38. Please give us an indoor pool.
39. Instead of underground parking, can the new facility be on top of the parking garage?
- Unfortunately, a parking garage is incredibly expensive and out of the range of the project budget.
40. indoor pool would be good.
41. So Early Childhood Center killed the pool.
42. Will residents of the area get a specific lottery or entry component for the early childhood option.
- Unfortunately, DPR does not currently have this information. We will be working with representatives from the Office of the State Superintendent of Education (OSSE) to try and have a representative present at our next community meeting. 46. How will access to the facilities be handled?
- DPR personnel will open and close the facilities. There will be employees from the Dept of General Services (DGS) who help maintain the facility, including day to day maintenance, repairs, etc. DPR's Park Rangers will open and close outdoor park fencing according to park hours.
47. Does that Early Childhood Center mean free childcare for folks with small children?

- DPR will be assessing the tennis courts and will repair as needed if costs are within the overall project budget.
49. It would be good to have double the bathrooms so that when some are broken, you have additional toilets to compensate.
50. Will adjacent parking be zoned?
- Street parking, specifically zoning and Residential Parking permits, is handled through DDOT. DPR does not have any purview over adjacent parking zoning requirements.
51. Can we hold off on the water feature until the future of the updating the pool? It would be so nice to have it connected to the current pool area like Langdon Park Pool.
- We believe that a water feature near the new facility is sorely needed to spread out the recreational assets throughout the large park. Unlike Langdon, we don't have a large amount of pool deck space for a large level of splash park elements at the existing outdoor pool.
52. Good Evening - TENNIS. We have 8 wonderful courts that are packed almost daily throughout the year. They are falling into disrepair. What plans are underway to modernize the tennis court surfaces, fencing, surrounding benches (existing and need new), receptacles? Are these items incorporated in the \$39M budget? TY
- The tennis courts are being evaluated as part of this project and if feasible given the project budget, will be improved.
53. Langdon park pool is at capacity for a good part of the summer. Some improvements to the pool at Hagans would take some of the pressure off of Langdon.
54. Is there a budget breakdown for how the money will be spent for each section of the park? I fear the "rehab" of the older sections will get little attention and we will end up with an awesome new building but the rest will stay in a near end of life state. a site this big requires so much maintenance. how will this park get the money it needs every year to maintain this monster of a site.
- We don't have specific budget breakdowns for each section of the park.
55. Yes- please look to add shade to the pool. Updates to the pool facility would really be nice.
56. Will it be a daycare or preschool?

61. How will this part year water feature sustainably manage water?
- The water feature has a recirculating pump which minimizes excess water waste.
62. I am convinced that there was never intention of building an indoor pool. It is obvious.
63. Was there any consideration to building a new elementary school, given that education is a key factor families consider when purchasing homes?
- Not at this location.
64. Can we see the survey results with the breakdown of the answers?

- It's meant to be a recreational amenity that is also aesthetic in nature.

71. It would be amazing to construct an "eagle's nest" structure near the gazebos that would allow a full view of the city and horizon/skyline over the townhouses on Ft Lincoln Drive.
72. Having the indoor pool concept included as a phase 2 opportunity is a win. There are trade-offs in cost. We'll need to advocate for additional funds for phase 2 to get the pool added.

73. How much would an indoor pool cost of the total budget? Would it eliminate a lot of the other amenities?
