




Project Overview

- Funding identified for the Kalorama Playground
 - Funding is for playground only.
 - Playground boundaries will remain the same.
- Project Budget: \$500,000
 - Includes: demo, new equipment, new wood surfacing, fencing, benches, picnic tables, etc.
- Timing is Critical
 - Need to begin construction parallel with plaza work to realize time and cost saving benefits.
