#### 2) SIT Overview

- a) Composed of 10-15 representatives, ideally no more than 12
  - i) Since this is a new school teachers will not be able to be involved in the SIT process until the 2<sup>nd</sup> year
  - ii) Opportunities to change ed spec with SIT input to create site-specific ed spec
- b) SIT helps with
  - i) Schematic design
  - ii) Ed spec
- c) SIT meetings
  - i) Meant to validate the ed spec's content

#### 3) Ed Spec Overview

- a) LEED
  - i) DCPS requires LEED Silver
  - ii) QEA aims for LEED Gold or higher
- b) 336 enrollment = 2 classes each for the following levels
  - i) Pre-K 3, Pre-K 4, 1st grade, 2nd grade, 3rd grade, 4th grade, 5th grade
- Special education will be integrated in the regular classes in the least restricted environment

d) Whatever is DCPS state-of-the-art at the time will be incorporated in the final design

## 4) Van Ness ES parent + community concerns

- a) Outdoor space
  - i) Outdoor play space needs protection from other spaces than for play
  - ii) Historic preservation and co-location with DPR to be determined
- b) Parking and traffic flow
  - i) Concerns
    - (1) Parking vs. open play space
      - (a) Deliveries, visitors, early-arriving students, commuters looking for short-term and long-term parking space
      - (b) Balance needs to be struck between school parking requirements availability of open play space
      - (c) Request to look into the feasibility of underground parking
      - (d) Teacher's Union agreement language
        - (i) 21.7.1 "Where possible, DCPS shall provide free parking to Teachers at each School"

    - (2) Traffic patterns on and across the site
      - (a) Loading and deliveries
      - (b) Local traffic patterns prevent through traffic
      - (c) How will students safely access the DPR property adjacent to the school?
      - (d) Security and safety of students
        - (i) Need for a strong visible entrance
        - (ii) Make sure the security guard has a home at the entrance
        - (iii) Manage entry/egress and egress-only points
        - (iv) Community requested that the design team map out arrival of student population
          - 1. Need 15-minute increments of traffic flow; QEA to provide
    - (3) The Lincoln Playground Field House, on the Joy Evans Recreation Center site (555 L St. SE)
      - (a) Historic Preservation Review Board application in progress
      - (b) Encumbers the site unless included in the program
        - (i) DPR may be looking into using the restored building for public restrooms
        - (ii) QEA would like to use it as additional teaching space, possibly an Exploration Lab
        - (iii) DGS will reach out to DPR to discuss future of existing building

### 5) <u>Design ideas</u>

- a) Window to have views to the exterior courtyard on every level.
- b) History of the neighborhood and of the Van Ness School should be expressed in the school.
  - i) Incorporation of maps history of school and neighborhood
- c) Riverfront vs Waterfront
- d) Van Ness ES theme
  - i) Considering Amidon-Bowen as a "waterfront community," the community relates Van Ness ES as a "riverfront community"

- Attention should be paid to the Anacostia river walk which is intended to be a large integrated path through the community and to other important sites beyond, including the National Arboretum
