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## Mayor Vincent C. Gray will Network with Hundreds of Local Contractors at "Opportunity Summit 2012" at DC Convention Center

(WASHINGTON, D.C.) – Mayor Vincent C. Gray will join hundreds of local contractors for a day of networking, and a review of active job opportunities with the District of Columbia's Department of General Services at the "Opportunity Summit 2012" tomorrow at the Walter E. Washington Convention Center.

"To achieve my administration's goal of transforming the District of Columbia into a world-class city, one of my five priorities as Mayor is a focus on jobs and economic development throughout the city," Mayor Gray said. Charged with constructing, maintaining and managing the District's real estate portfolio of over 30 million square feet – including schools, parks, office buildings and other municipal facilities – DGS is dedicated to good stewardship of the spaces where residents and visitors work, live and play.
